


# **Elective English Course's calculated in a student's HOPE GPA:**


- Yearbook Journalism I, Journalism II, Journalism III, and Journalism IV, are offered as electives and an application is required.
- Reading Enrichment is an elective that is paired with Ninth Literature for qualifying students.

### **Mathematics**




- Foundations of Algebra counts toward graduation but will not meet admissions for acceptance into a four-year college unless student takes a 5<sup>th</sup> math course during senior year.
- Students may take AP Calculus AB and AP Calculus BC (if available) during senior year. Student must take Pre-Calculus as pre-requisite course.

## Science



- \*NPHS 4<sup>th</sup> Science options Environmental Science, Zoology, Honors Zoology, Forensic Science, AP Chemistry (must have Honors Chemistry as pre-requisite), AP Physics (must have Honors Physics as pre-requisite), AP Biology (must have Honors Biology as pre-requisite), Anatomy/Physiology.
- Student must take Physical Science <u>or</u> Physics to meet graduation requirements.
- Students who complete Essentials of Healthcare under the healthcare pathway, will receive an embedded Anatomy/Physiology credit on their high school transcript. Students will need to be sure this credit will be accepted for admission into a four-year college.

## Social Studies



- \*World Geography, Honors World Geography, and AP Human Geography are elective courses and do not meet the 3 social studies credits required to graduate. These courses do count toward a student's HOPE GPA because they are academic electives. These courses are highly encouraged to take to bridge the gap between World Geography and World History curriculum.
- Other Social Studies Electives that do not meet graduation requirements that are counted toward a student's HOPE GPA are: Psychology, Sociology. Current Issues, and Humanities (online).
