The Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. essay contest will be administered by the Education Activities Committee of the Rho Pi Lambda Chapter with a maximum of 3 recipients from Douglas, Paulding, and Carroll Counties. The total dollars awarded for this scholarship is \$1,000. This packet includes the instructions, descriptions of scholarships, and grading rubric.

Eligibility Requirements:

- African American male who will be a 2023 graduating high school senior attending high school in either Douglas, Paulding, Carroll County, GA, or surrounding service area.
- Must be accepted and preparing to attend a community college, junior college, a four (4) year college or university in the Fall of 2023.

How to Apply

- Essay submissions will be accepted until <u>Friday</u>, <u>March 31</u>, <u>2023</u>. **All materials must be submitted** electronically as an email attachment in <u>Microsoft Word format to <u>dandreflint@comcast.net</u>.</u>
- Late or incomplete materials will **not** be considered.
- Complete the Common Application, and include it as an attachment along with your essay.
- Once your completed application is received you will receive an electronic confirmation of receipt from the scholarship committee.

Essay Questions

• Candidates must select from one of the three essay topics provided below:

Essay Topic Number 1:

Voting rights are under attack nationwide as states pass voter suppression laws. These laws lead to significant burdens for eligible voters trying to exercise their most fundamental constitutional right. Since 2008, states across the country have passed measures to make it harder for Americans—particularly black people, the elderly, students, and people with disabilities—to exercise their fundamental right to cast a ballot.

What are some of the measures used to make it more difficult to vote? What are some solutions to combating

these measures? What things can be done to have more young Americans participate in the voting process?

Essay Topic Number 2:

"The secret of our success is that we never, never give up." - Wilma Mankiller.

Describe a time when you failed at something. What were the circumstances? How did you respond to failure?

What lessons did you learn?

Essay Topic Number 3:

"Among young adult males, college enrollment rates were higher in 2016 than in 2000 for Blacks (33 vs. 25 percent)" – College Enrollment Rates – National Center for Education Studies

As the rates of African-American males attending college increase, why do you want to attend college? Describe

three things you want to accomplish in college? How will attending college help you achieve your life goals?

Essay Format Instructions

- Provide a title page that includes the essay topic of choice, your full name and high school.
- Use the standard margins of 1" on the top and bottom margins and 1.25" on the left and right margins.
- Use double-spaced text
- Essay text is to be left aligned.
- Use standard font "Times New Roman" size 12.
- Paragraphs are identified by an indentation of five spaces (a tab); do not make extra spaces between paragraphs.
- Essay should not be in all caps or in all bold letters.

Assessment Criteria

Each essay will be reviewed by a panel of Brothers from the Rho Pi Lambda chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. Each essay will be assessed using the following criteria:

- Relevance to theme
- Plausible solution to the problem embedded in the theme
- Proper grammar and syntax
- Format of essay
