- 4 Units of English
- 4 Units of Mathematics
- 4 Units of Science
- 3 Units of Social Studies
- 3 Units of Career/Technology and/or World Language and/or Fine Arts
- 1 Unit of Health & Physical Education
- 4 Units of Electives (minimum)

A total of 23 Units

NOTE: World Language (Foreign Language) is not required for graduation BUT is required for acceptance into a 4-year College or University in Georgia.



Students must have a minimum of the following number of credits to be promoted:

- **From 9th to 10th grade- 5 credits**
- **From 10th to 11th grade- 11 credits**
- **From 11th to 12th grade – 17 credits**

JROTC Substitution:

The Health and Personal Fitness courses can be replaced by three (3) credits of JROTC.

Is a World Language Required to Graduate?

Taking a World Language course is NOT required for graduation, but students who wish to gain admission to a four-year college/university must complete two (2) units of the same World (foreign) Language.

HOW TO READ PCSD TRANSCRIPTS

- Two GPA's, Numeric and 4.0 GPA
- Class Rank is based on the Numeric GPA
- High school courses taken in middle school, will be the first listed under Grade 09
- Semester Grades, Unweighted and Weighted are posted under "**Mark**"
- "**Weight**" indicates how much the course was worth in terms of credits
- "**Credit**" shows the credit earned
- If the class was **passed**, the Credit number should **match** the number indicated under Weight
- If the class was **failed**, the Credit will be recorded as a **zero**.
- Credit Summary is the total number of credits attempted and earned.

TRANSCRIPTS



Transcripts are available for viewing at any time in your Infinite Campus Account.



You should become familiar with your transcript and view it often.



You should become familiar with your GAFutures Transcript. This is how you will find your HOPE GPA.

YOUR GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

HIGH SCHOOL GPA

- Average of the final grades in every class taken for high school credit
- Will include weighted points awarded for rigor in Honors, AP, and/or DE courses
- Used to determine class rank, honor graduate status, and any other local use of GPA
- This is the GPA that colleges will use for admissions purposes
- This is also the GPA that most scholarship committees will use
- PCSD transcript will show your weighted and unweighted GPA on the 100-point scale and the 4.0 scale

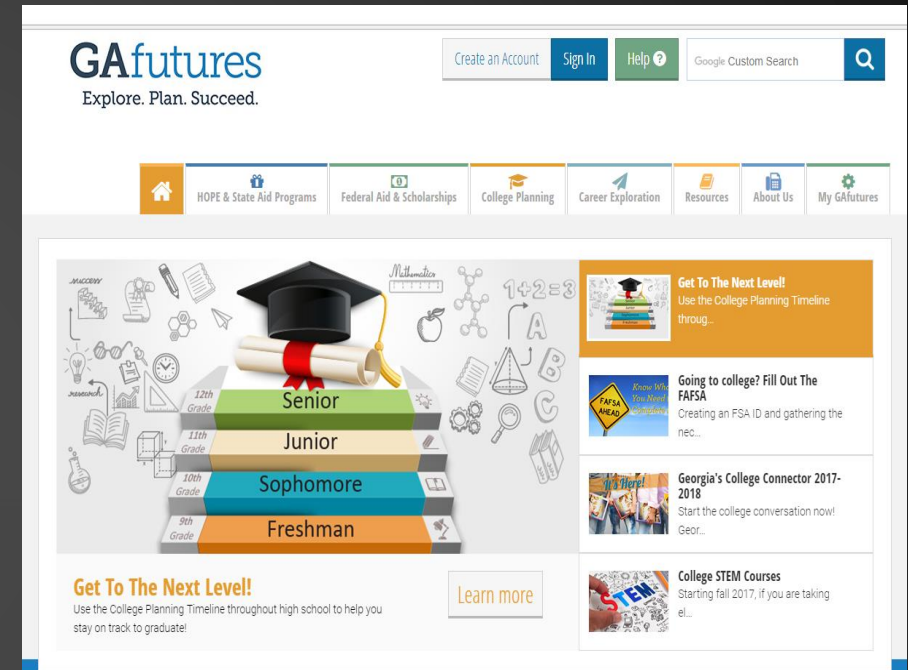
HOPE GPA

- Determined by the GA Student Finance Commission using transcripts submitted by PCSD.
- Expressed on a 4.0 scale (at least a 3.0 to qualify for HOPE and 4 rigor courses as listed on the GAFutures website)
- Average of your academic core, academic electives, and World Language grades
- Does not include high school credits completed in middle school
- Local weights for Honors, AP, and DE courses are removed (GSFC will add their own weights for AP and DE, not for Honors courses)
- Estimated HOPE GPA can be viewed by logging into your GAFutures account

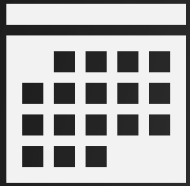

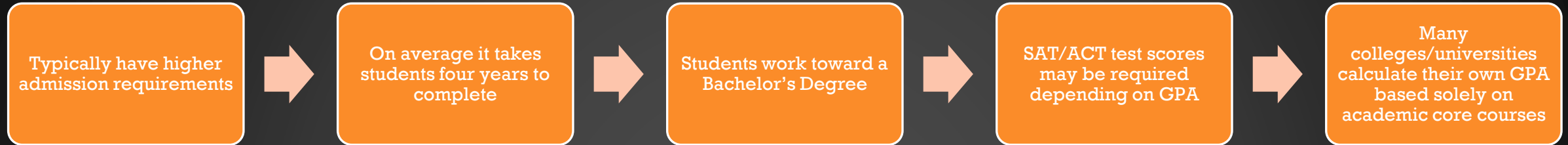

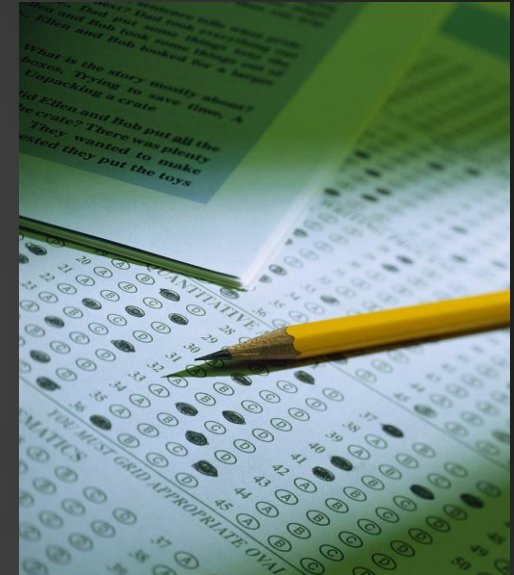

The SAT takes three hours and consists of three tests: (1) the Reading Test, (2) the Writing and Language Test, and (3) the Math Test. Compared to the ACT®, the SAT provides 43% more time per question:

Component	Time Allotted (minutes)	Number of Questions/Tasks
Reading	65	52
Writing and Language	35	44
Math	80	58
Total	180	154

Most of the questions are multiple choice, though some of the math questions ask you to write in the answer rather than select it.

On all questions, there's no penalty for guessing: if you're not sure of the answer, it's better to guess than leave the response blank.

ACT Test Descriptions

The ACT test consists of four multiple-choice sections—in English, mathematics, reading, and science—with an optional writing section.

Your scores will be based only on the number of questions that you answer correctly; there is no penalty for guessing. Try to answer every question within the time allowed for each section.

REQUESTING TRANSCRIPTS

Transcript requests are made one of two ways

- **In-State** requests are made online through your **GA Futures account**
 - **Out-of-State** requests are made online through **Scriborder**
- Once you make a request, allow a few days for the college to receive and download the transcript
- A detailed description of how each of these requests are sent can be found on the counseling website under **“TRANSCRIPTS AND RECORDS”**

INITIAL VS. FINAL TRANSCRIPT

- When you apply to a college, you will request your **initial transcript**. This will usually include grades through the end of your junior year.
 - Some colleges may require that you submit a **mid-year transcript** in January of your senior year to see your grades from the first semester of your senior year. If you completed the Common Application, we automatically send this.
 - After graduation, your college will expect you to submit a **final transcript**. This final transcript will include your grades from spring semester of your senior year and your date of graduation.
